Self-Testing Guide



Follow these 12 steps to complete your COVID-19 CareStart self-test.

— OPTIONAL — Not a required step to use the test.





Download the On/Go results app. Scan the QR code above. Sign up and create an account or if you have the app, simply log-in to start. 2



Follow along with the On/Go app instructions. Before self- testing, thoroughly wash your hands for 20 seconds.

3



Unpack the test kit from the box. The test kit includes a test cassette, a vial with a lid and a nasal swab.

4



Open the package and remove the test cassette.

5



Carefully peel off the foil on the top of the vial.



Remove the nasal swab from the pouch. **Do not touch the tip of the swab.**



7



Take the nasal swab and insert it into your right nostril. Rotate the swab 5 times or 15 seconds, then do the same on your left nostril.

Rotate the swab 5 times before removing it. As you remove it from the vial, ensure the liquid is squeezed from the swab into the vial. Dispose of the nasal swab.

9



Take the lid and place it on the vial. Make sure it snaps closed by pushing down firmly.

10



Add 3 drops from the vial onto the test cassette. Next, the app will set a 10 minute wait time to obtain your results. Do not move the test cassette.


Once the 10 minute wait time is up, you have 5 minutes to take a picture of your test results.

The On/Go app will guide you to accurately confirm your test results by asking you questions about the number of bars, their colors and where they are located.
